
Trumpeter Swans on Christain Pond

This pair of Trumpeter Swans routinely nest on Christain Pond. The Trumpeter Swan is the largest native North American bird, if measured in terms of weight and length. They were heavily hunted in the 19th century, and were largely believed extinct by 1900. By 1932, 69 of these birds had been documented in the region around Yellowstone. Although not officially on an endangered species list today, they are still quite rare with something like 1500 birds migrating to or living in the continental US.


Lower Yellowstone Falls

If one is willing to take Uncle Tom's Trail down into the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone during mid-day, you can be rewarded with a spectacular view of the Lower Yellowstone Falls and a nice rainbow in its mist. The only catch is that this trail consists of 328 steps down, which means climbing back up those 328 steps at an elevation of about 8,000 feet.


Terraces by Grand Prismatic Spring

From the air, Grand Prismatic Spring looks dominantly blue. From the ground, what dominates is the huge set of terraces formed by little rimstone dams created from minerals in the runoff. The hot water near the spring creates red and orange bacteria mats. As the water cools farther from the spring, you get the darker browns seen here.


Sandhill Cranes


Mount Moran reflected in Oxbow Bend
