
Pika

Pikas look like large rodents or small rabbits (with small ears). They do not hibernate during the winter, and have very thick fur coats to keep them warm--so warm in fact that they can die from heat if the temperatures get above the mid 70s. As a result, Pikas are only found at very high elevations, typically in the 8,000-13,000 foot elevation range. We found this Pika at about 9800 feet.




Fly Agaric Mushrooms




Mountain Reflection


Bridalveil Fall and Leaning Tower
